People: we give you thanks, O God; and we rejoice in the gift

of Christ's risen presence with us. Amen.

Loving God, you have shown yourself to us by Word and Spirit, with signs and wonders, in flesh and blood, yet we struggle to live and believe the good news of Jesus Christ. Have mercy on us; forgive us. Enter into our lives and cast out our fear and doubt so that we may come to trust in you and have life in Jesus' name. Amen.

Jesus Loves Me Moment

*Sacred Story from John 20:19-23

It was still the first day of the week. That evening, while the disciples were behind closed doors because they were afraid of the Jewish authorities, Jesus came and stood among them. He said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. When the disciples saw the Lord, they were filled with joy. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I am sending you." Then he breathed on them, and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, they are forgiven; if you don't forgive them, they aren't forgiven."

Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here. Look at my hands. Put your hand into my side. No more disbelief. Believe!" Thomas responded to Jesus, My Lord

and my God!" Jesus replied, "Do you believe because you see me? Happy are those who don't see and yet believe."
