

Marilyn's passing was a shock and blow to so many. She started a great mission in Kenya for those who needed help in getting an education. The Mission of the school was to get the least of these through High School. Over the years the organization drifted from its main mission of just supporting students in high school and started helping students attend college. This drift started taking away from

the students who wanted to attend high school and getting sponsorship. After much thought and prayer the leadership decided to go back to the original mission of the school and just to support those who are attending high school. From Form 1 through Form 4.


Living Hope will no longer be involved in using the school account for future college students. College students who are already enrolled and are being sponsored will have the ability to continue to use and be filtered through our account. This will only be available for the first four years of college or trade school and they must be currently enrolled. If you have any concerns or communication for sponsorship of students/college students at Living Hope, you should speak with the U.S. coordinator, Sandy Binotto. She will then coordinate with leadership within the school.

It was discussed that we put in place two college scholarships at the school for one boy and girl with the highest grades for 2024. The amount of the scholarships is still being discussed. A College information check list will be sent to each student in college to fill out with their college information. It will then be sent to the sponsor and filed at the school. We are now trying to resource students in form's 3-4 with information on how to go to college without sponsorship and looking at grants and scholarships that are available. New Form One Students

We have new Form one students who need Sponsorship and some from Form 2 and three's. Below are some of them. Their Bios will be on the website shortly and if you would like to view them in the next few days you can contact Sandy Binotto for them. Since some new students were accepted recently we are still writing up their biographies.

All students live on site in dormitories. They get 3 meals a day and a good Christian Education. Many get a bed and blanket for the first time. Most of all they get love! The teachers and staff do all they can to nurture and mentor the students and give them Hope! It cost \$110.00 a month to sponsor a student. The school also asks for \$10 to \$15 a month extra that goes into their accounts for toiletries, shoe polish, pens, or notebooks, whatever the need might be. When they reach Form 4 they will have to have a computer class and exam testing mandated by the government. We ask an extra \$200.00 for that, it is due several months before they graduate. If you can't sponsor a student on your own, we suggest you do it as a group, Sunday School Class, or youth group.
