

My name is Job Wekesa and I am 19 years old. Thank goodness that I am a Christian because God has been helping me since I was born. I grew up in slums and at the age of 3, my parents divorced. My little sister went with my mom and I went with my dad. My father was not a good father. I was living on the street and God helped me to avoid death and many accidents.

At the age of 6, I was walking on the street and met a man who wanted to know all about me. I told him of my troubles and he decided to help me to

go to my grandparents at that Point I had never been at school. And my grandfather paid my fees and took me to school. My grandparents were very old and could not afford my school fees so I was sent home many times. I decided to go live with my aunt. These arrangements worked out until I was in P7. My Aunt and her husband had a great fight over me. The husband didn't want me. My Aunt gave up sponsoring me and I decided to drop out of school. During the day I hustled for money doing anything I could for money. I saved every shilling that I could. I joined the school again and paid my way to take the National Primary exam. Because I had missed so much School, My score was low. I joined a group of kids doing construction jobs. One day I went to work and the owner whom I did not know called me over and wanted to know why I wasn't in School. He was a teacher. He said he would talk to his friend to see if he can get me back to school. The teacher told me about Living Hope High School. The teacher brought me to Living Hope and talked to the principal. After a short time I came and interviewed and even though my grades were poor, they could see I had the potential and gave me a chance. I have been at Living Hope for one term. Right now I have a B plain and I am working very hard to improve my grades. I would like to do something in the medical field and I am looking for opportunities. I need a sponsor to get me through the next two terms, Pay my back fees and help me go to college. I have no one to help me and no family support. I am praying hard for your support and prayers.

I believe that God has been giving me all this troubles and challenges to make me tough and Rely on Him. I am praying for you. God is at work
